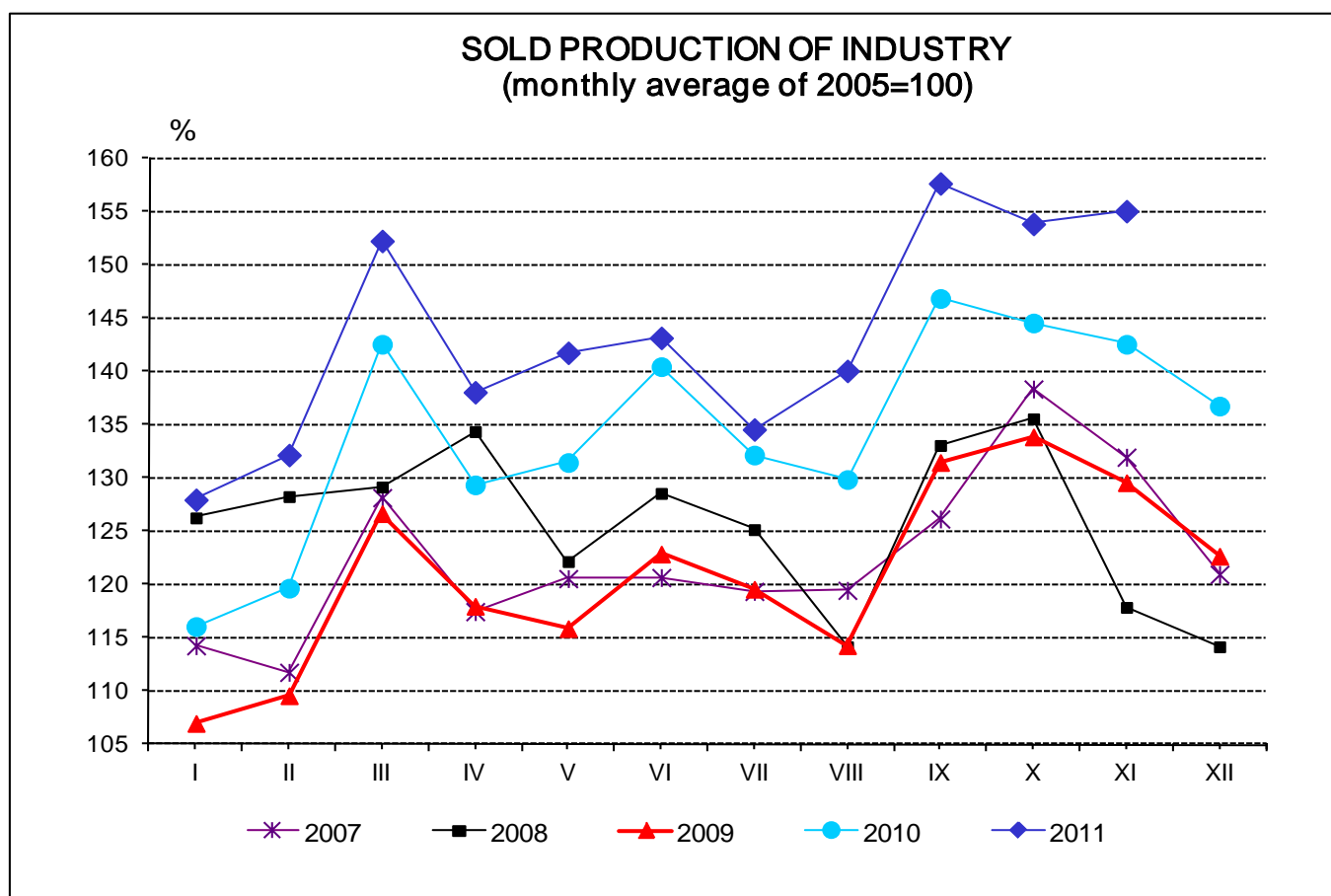

According to the preliminary data **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in November 2011 was by 8.7% higher than in the previous year and by 0.7% higher than in October 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 9.2% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 1.6% than in October 2011.

As compared to November 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 26 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of furniture – by 20.8%, manufacture of basic metals – by 19.2%, manufacture of metal products – by 18.6%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 14.9%, manufacture of rubber and plastics products – by 11.3% and manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 10.8%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to November 2010, was recorded in 8 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 15.1%, in mining of coal and lignite – by 11.2%, in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 7.6% and manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 7.1%

In the period January-November 2011 sold production of industry was by 7.8% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in November 2011 by 13.0% higher than a year before and by 7.5% lower than in October 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 16.5% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 2.6% than in October 2011.

In comparison to November of the previous year, an increase in production was recorded in all divisions of construction entities, including entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities – by 20.4%, in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 15.5%, and in entities specialising in the construction of buildings – by 6.2%.

In comparison to October 2011, a decrease in production was recorded in all divisions of construction. The largest decrease concerned entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 9.7%, whereas in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities it amounted to 7.6%, and in entities specialising in the construction of buildings to 4.5%.

In the period January-November 2011 construction and assembly production was by 16.6% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
