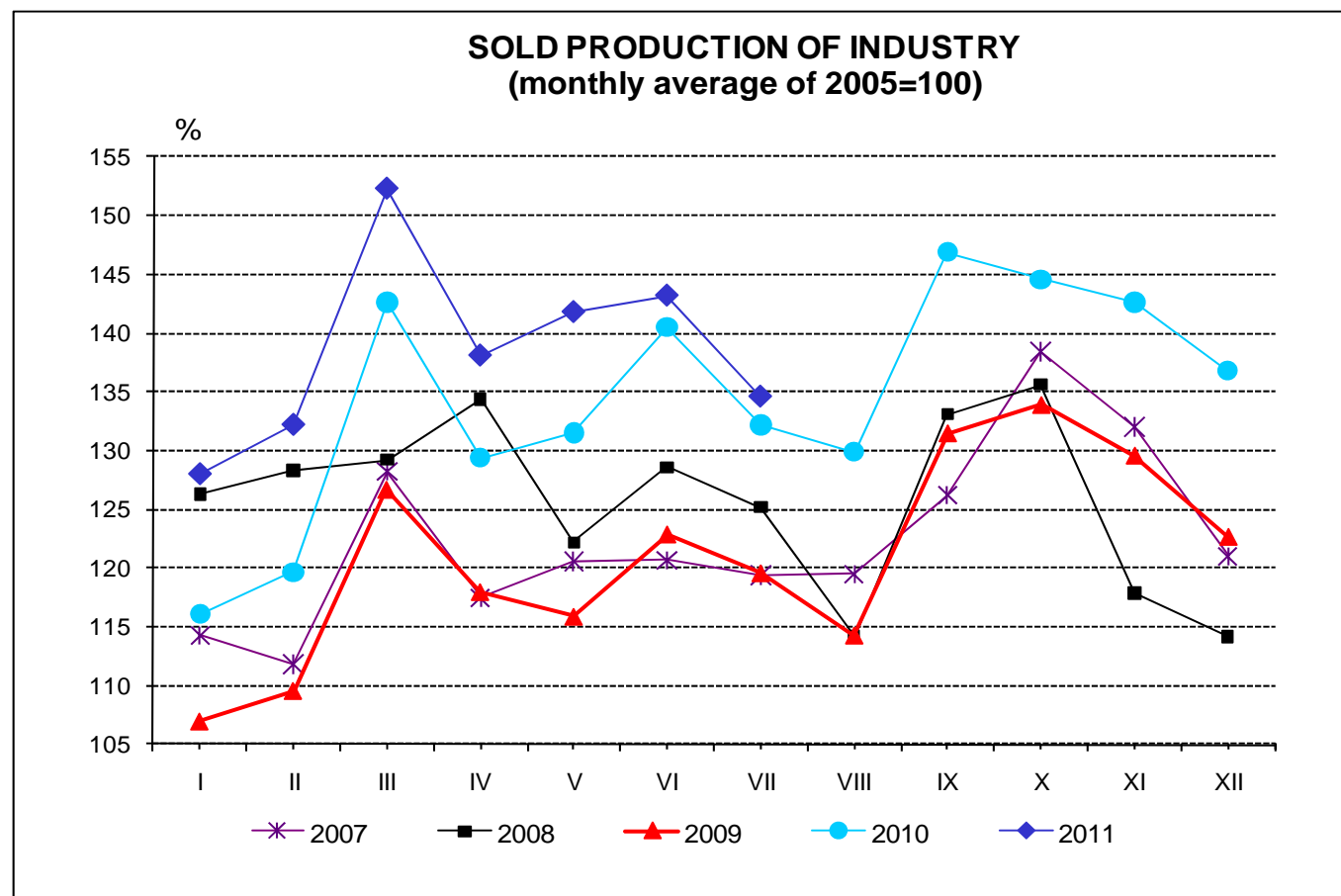

According to the preliminary data **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in July 2011 was by 1.8% higher than in the previous year, but lower by 6.0% than in June 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 4.6% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 0.4% than in June 2011.

As compared to July 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 19 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of basic metals – by 18.8%, manufacture of metal products – by 15.6%, manufacture of furniture – by 15.5%, manufacture of electrical equipment – by 10.1%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 8.7% and manufacture of rubber and plastic products – by 6.5%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to July 2010, was recorded in 15 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of beverages – by 22.4%, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 13.9%, in mining of coal and lignite – by 13.0%, in manufacture of chemicals and chemical products – by 8.7%, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 6.1% and manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 4.2%.

In the period January-July 2011 sold production of industry was by 6.4% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in July of 2011 was by 16.4% higher than in the previous year but by 3.5% lower than in June of 2011. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 18.9% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 1.2% higher in comparison to June of 2011.

In comparison to July of the previous year, an increase in the amount of work completed occurred in all divisions of construction, i.e. in enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 27.2%, in units primarily carrying out specialized construction activities – by 23.1%, and in entities dealing mainly with construction of buildings – by 4.2%.

In comparison to June of 2011, an increase in production by 2.4% was recorded in units dealing mainly with construction of buildings, while a decline occurred in enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 7.6%, and in entities carrying out specialized construction activities – by 5.3%.

The level of construction and assembly production realised in the period January-July of 2011 was by 19.9% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
