

According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons), in November of 2012, was by 0.8% lower than in the previous year (when an increase by 8.5% was recorded) and by 4.8% lower than in October of 2012. After eliminating the seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level lower by 1.9% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and lower by 0.9% than in October of 2012.

As compared to November of 2011, a drop in sold production was reported in 12 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 10.6%, manufacture of furniture – by 9.6%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 8.0%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 7.9%, manufacture of basic metals – by 7.6% and manufacture of rubber and plastics products – by 3.7%. An increase in sold production of industry, as compared to November of 2011, was recorded in 22 divisions, among others, in manufacture of electrical equipment – by 5.5%, manufacture of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker – by 5.2%, manufacture of paper and paper products – by 4.4%, in mining of coal and lignite – by 4.0%, in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 3.9% and manufacture of food products – by 3.5%.

In the period January-November of 2012, sold production of industry was by 2.1% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in November of 2012 by 5.3% lower than a year before and by 9.1% lower in comparison to October of 2012. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level 10.7% lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year and 1.5% lower in comparison to October of 2012.

A decrease in production was recorded in all divisions of construction, both compared with November of 2011 and October of 2012. In relation to November of 2011 this decrease amounted to: in entities specialising in construction of buildings by 7.6%, in entities performing specialized construction activities by 5.0%, and in enterprises, whose basic type of activity is work connected with civil engineering by 3.5%. In comparison to October 2012 reduction of carried out construction work amount to: in entities realizing mainly construction work connected with construction of buildings – by 17.9%, in enterprises performing specialized construction activities – by 4.1%, and in enterprises specialising in work connected with civil engineering – by 3.3%.

In the period January-November of 2012, construction and assembly production was 1.5% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
