

### General government deficit and debt in 2009

On 31 March 2010, in accordance with the *Council Regulation (EC) No 479/2009 of 25 May 2009 on the application of the Protocol on the excessive deficit procedure annexed to the Treaty establishing European Community*, the President of the CSO provided general government deficit and debt data (fiscal notification) to the European Commission (Eurostat).

According to the EDP notification, in 2009 general government deficit amounted to PLN 95 730 m (7,1% GDP) and general government debt was equal PLN 684 365 m (51,0% GDP). For 2010 Ministry of Finance forecasts general government deficit equal PLN 97 033 m (6,9% GDP), whereas general government debt: PLN 755 043 m (53,5% GDP).
