According to preliminary data, **the prices of sold production of industry** in August of 2011 were by 0.4% higher than in the previous month. The highest growth of prices was recorded in manufacturing as well as in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (by 0.5% each). In manufacturing the biggest price growth was recorded in manufacture of pharmaceutical products (by 1.8%). The growth of prices was recorded among other things in manufacturing of chemicals and chemical products (by 1.2%), of machinery and equipment, of other transport equipment (by 1.1% each), of manufacturing of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers (by 0.9%), of rubber and plastic products (by 0.8%), of other non-metallic mineral products, of wearing apparel (by 0.6% each), of metal products, of electrical equipment (by 0.5% each), of textiles (by 0.4%), of food products, of paper and paper products, of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 0.3% each), of basic metals (by 0.2%), of coke and refined petroleum products, of computer, electronic and optical products as well as of furniture (by 0.1% each). However, the drop was recorded in the prices among other things in manufacturing of beverages (of 0.4%), of printing and reproduction of recorded media (of 0.9%). The prices in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities raised by 0.2%. However the prices in mining and quarrying was lower (of 1.0%), of which in mining of metal ores (of 2.1%), as well as in mining of coal and lignite (of 0.8%).

In comparison to December of the previous year the prices of sold production of industry raised by 4.7%. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (by 5.5%). The growth of prices was recorded in manufacturing (by 5.0%), of which the biggest in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 17.4%). Prices were raised also among other things in manufacture of basic metals (by 9.9%), of chemicals and chemical products (by 8.2%), of food products (by 7.5%), of rubber and plastic products (by 5.6%), of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 5.3%), of paper and paper products (by 4.8%), of pharmaceutical products (by 4.6%), of other non-metallic mineral products (by 3.7%), of textiles (by 3.0%), of machinery and equipment (by 2.6%), of metal products as well as of beverages (by 2.4% each). However the drop was recorded in the prices among other things in printing and reproduction of recorded media (of 1.9%), in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (of 2.6%). The prices in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities raised by 4.3% as well as in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply - by 2.6%.

In August of 2011 the prices of sold production of industry were by 6.6% higher than a year earlier. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (of 16.1%). The prices were also increased in section: manufacturing (of 6.4%), water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (of 6.3%), as well as in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (of 3.8%).

It is estimated that **the prices of construction and assembly production** in August of 2011 were by 0.3% higher than in the previous month. The growth prices was recorded in construction of buildings, in specialised construction activities (by 0.3% each) as well as in civil engineering (by 0.2%).

In August 2011 the prices of construction and assembly production were by 1.6% higher than in December of previous year and by 1.4% higher than in August of the previous year.

in 2010-2011

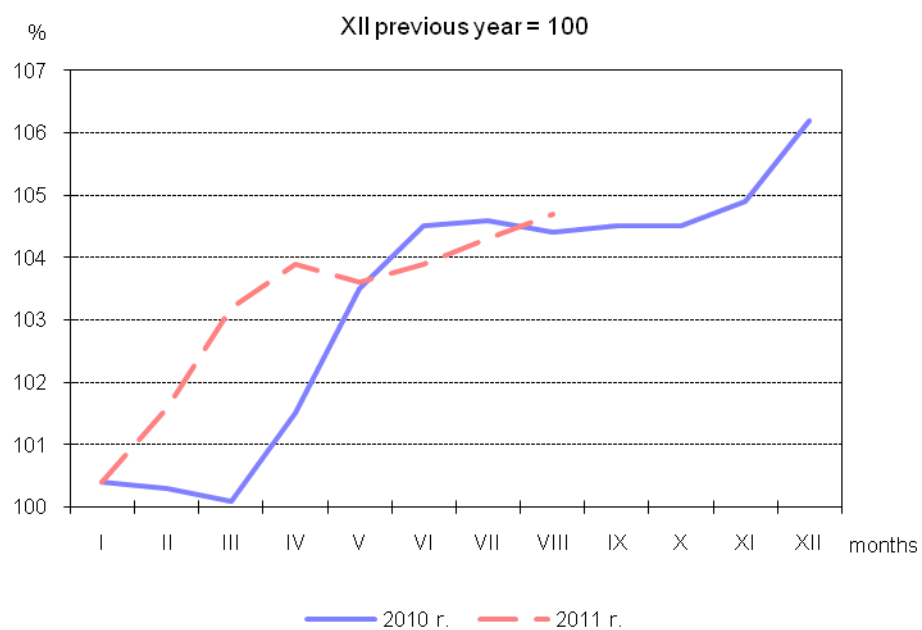

in 2010-2011

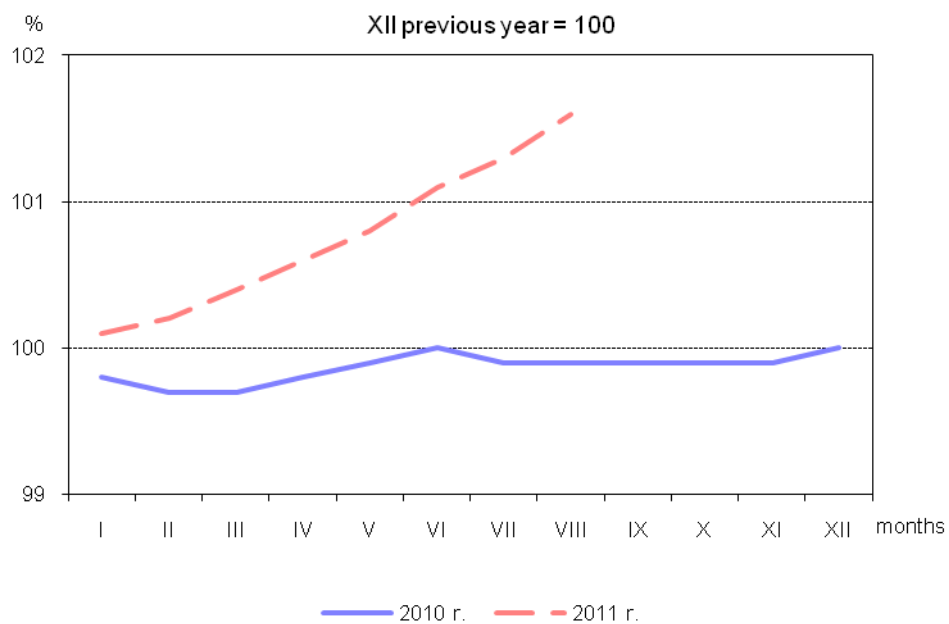

XII previous year = 100

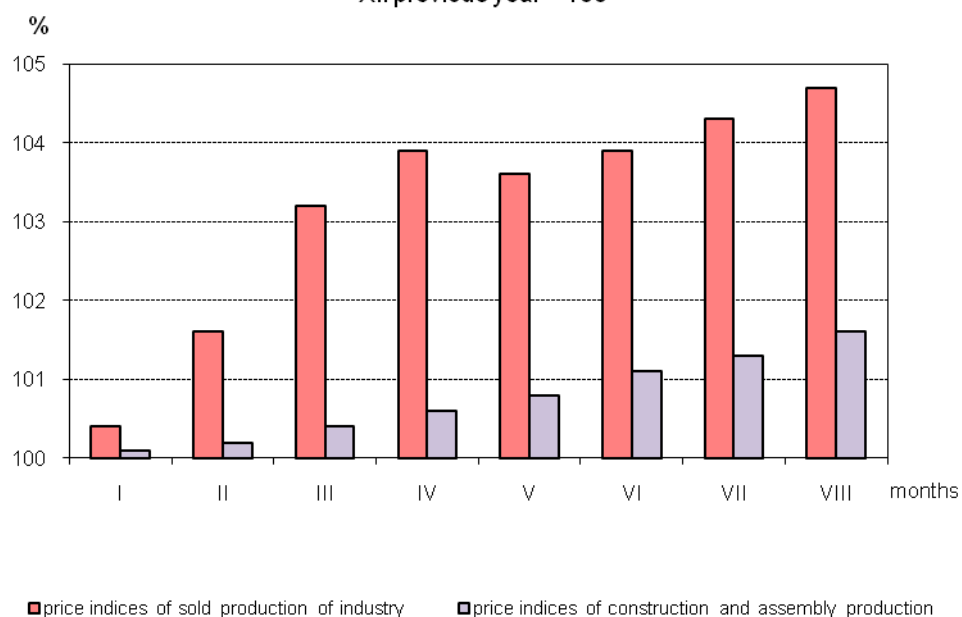
