





Neoplasms are the second leading cause of death in Poland. According to the latest data in 2013 there were 519 oncologists (oncological pathology and children's oncology and hematology) almost 4 times more than 2005. The number of beds in the oncological wards was 5509 (over 40% more than in 2005). In 2013 there were 345 thous. persons registered in the oncological wards (almost double increase compared with 2005).









