Growth of producer prices in industry and in construction in comparison to the previous month

According to preliminary data in September 2018 the prices of sold production of industry as well as construction and assembly production were by 0.4 % higher in comparison to the August 2018.

According to preliminary data in September 2018 the prices of sold production of industry were higher by 2.9% in comparison to September 2017. The prices increase was also recorded in construction and assembly production – by 3.3%. In the period January-September 2018 the prices of sold production of industry were higher by 1.9% in comparison to the corresponding period 2017 (when the growth was recorded – by 3.3%) and the prices of construction and assembly production increased by 2.4% (the growth in the previous year – by 0.4%).

The prices in industry in September 2018 in annual terms were higher by 2.9%, in construction – by 3.3%

In September 2018 in comparison to the previous month this year the rise of prices was recorded in sections: manufacturing, electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities. The drop of prices was noticed in section mining and quarrying. Prices in all sections of industry increased in comparison to corresponding month of the previous year.

The prices of sold production of industry

According to preliminary data in September 2018, **the prices of sold production of industry** were higher by 0.4% in comparison to the previous month. The prices in section manufacturing increased also by 0.4%. The biggest growth of prices was recorded in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 2.0%). The prices also increased, among others in manufacturing of leather and related products (by 1.4%), of chemicals and chemical products (by 0.7%), of pharmaceutical products, of metal products (by 0.5% each), of paper and paper products, of other non-metallic mineral products (by 0.4% each), of food products, of rubber and plastic products, of electrical equipment, of motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers (by 0.3% each), of basic metals, of computer, electronic and optical products (by 0.2% each). The prices in manufacture of other transport equipment remained unchanged to the ones recorded in August 2018. The drop of prices was recorded among other things in printing and reproduction of recorded media, manufacture of machinery and equipment n.e.c (by 0.1% each), of products of wood, cork, straw, of furniture (by 0.2% each), of textiles (by 0.3%), of wearing apparel (by 0.4%), of beverages (by 0.5%), of tobacco products (by 0.6%). The prices in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply increased by 0.2% and in section water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities by 0.1%. The drop of prices was recorded in section mining and quarrying by 0.2%.

In September 2018 the prices of sold production of industry were higher by 2.9% than a year earlier. The biggest rise of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying by 4.7% of which the most in mining of coal and lignite (by 12.4%) with the drop in prices in mining of metal ores (by 6.6%). The prices also increased in manufacturing by 3.0%, of which the most in manufacturing of coke and refined petroleum products (by 27.1%). The growth of prices was also recorded among others in manufacture of basic metals (by 6.6%), of leather and related products, of paper and paper products (by 5.3% each), of chemicals and chemical products (by 4.1%), of other non-metallic mineral products (by 3.9%), of textiles (by 3.2%), of tobacco products (by 2.7%), of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 2.2%), of wearing apparel (by 2.1%), of beverages, of metal products (by 2.0% each), of printing and reproduction of recorded media, of rubber and plastic products, of furniture (by 0.9% each), of pharmaceutical products (by 0.6%), of electrical equipment (by 0.5%). The drop of prices was recorded among other things in manufacture of food products, of motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers (by 0.2% each), of machinery and equipment n.e.c., of other transport equipment (by 0.3% each). The biggest drop in prices was recorded in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (by 1.6%). The prices in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply increased by 1.3% and in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities—by 1.1%.

The prices of construction and assembly production

The prices of construction and assembly production in September 2018 were higher by 0.4% than in the previous month. The growth of prices was recorded in construction of buildings (by 0.5%), civil engineering (by 0.4%) as well as in specialised construction activities (by 0.3%).

In comparison to September of the previous year, the prices of construction and assembly production were higher by 3.3% out of that the prices in construction of buildings (by 3.6%), in civil engineering (by 3.4%) as well as in specialised construction activities (by 2.7%).

In September 2018 in comparison to the previous month the biggest growth of prices was recorded in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products by 2.0% (in comparison to December 2017 the rise was 19.4% and in comparison to September of the previous year – 27.1%)

Prices in construction in September 2018 in annual terms increased in all divisions of construction.

Chart 1. Dynamics of prices in 2018 (XII previous year = 100)

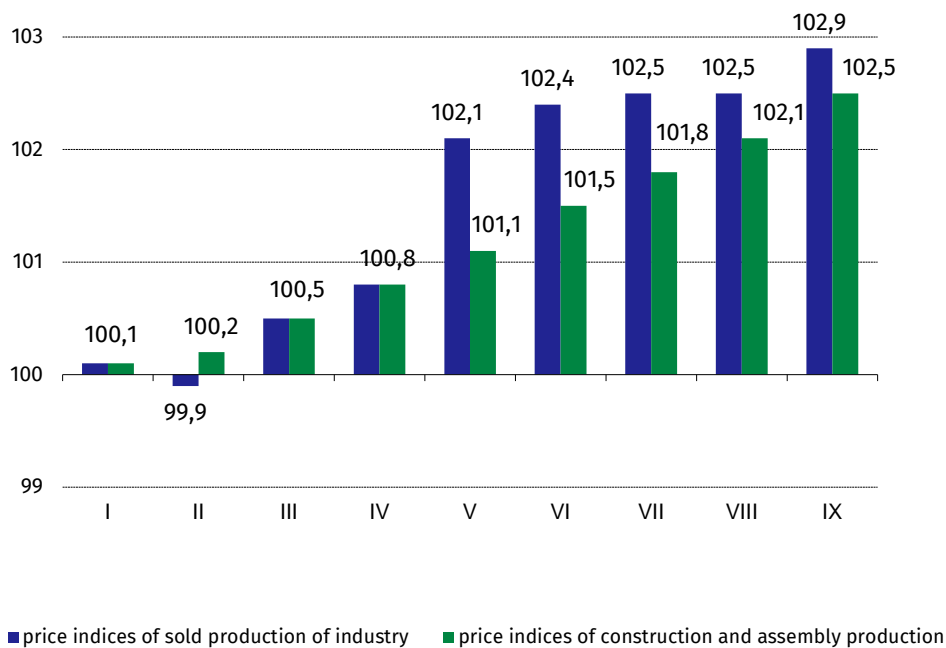


Chart 2. Dynamics of prices of sold production of industry in 2017-2018 (XII previous year = 100)

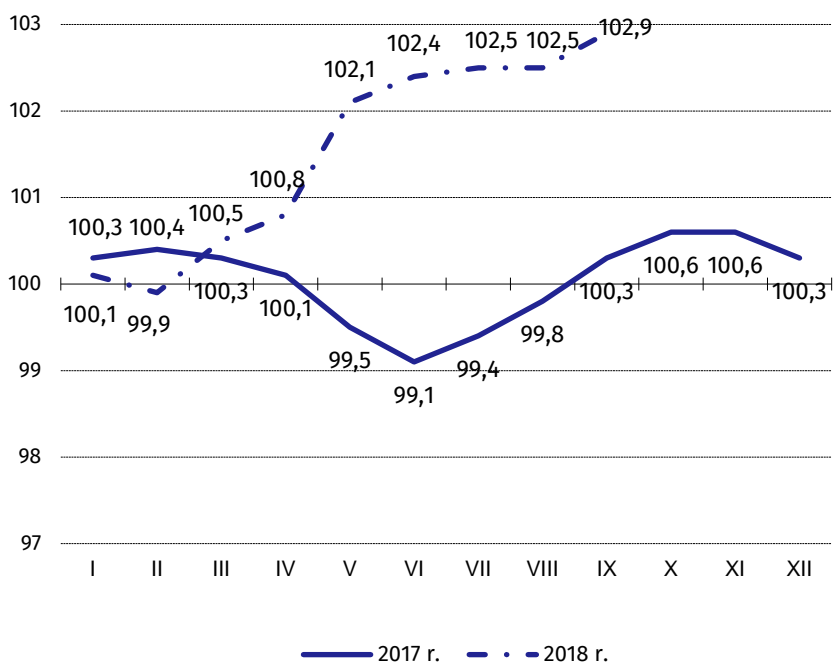


Chart 3. Dynamics of prices of assembly and construction production in 2017-2018 (XII previous year = 100)

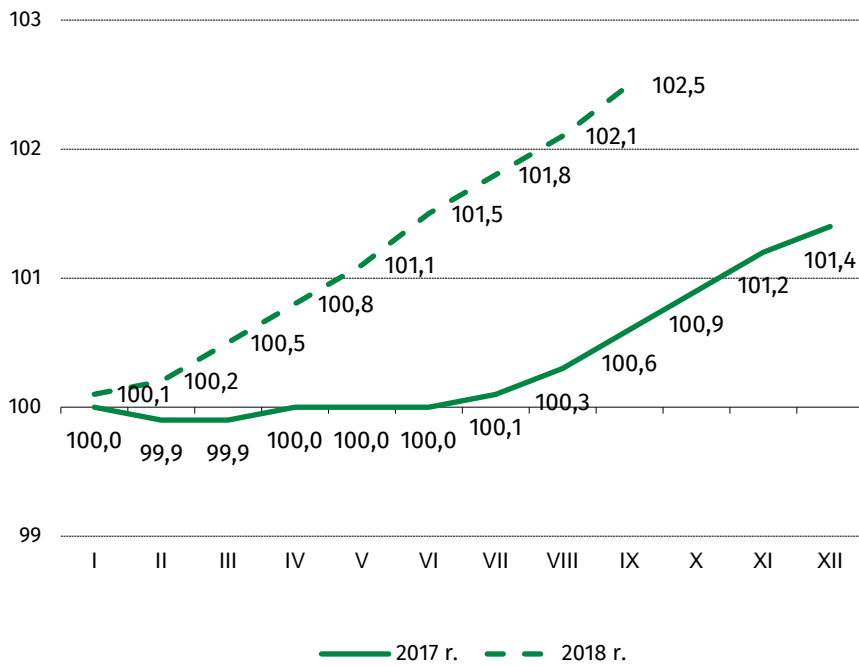
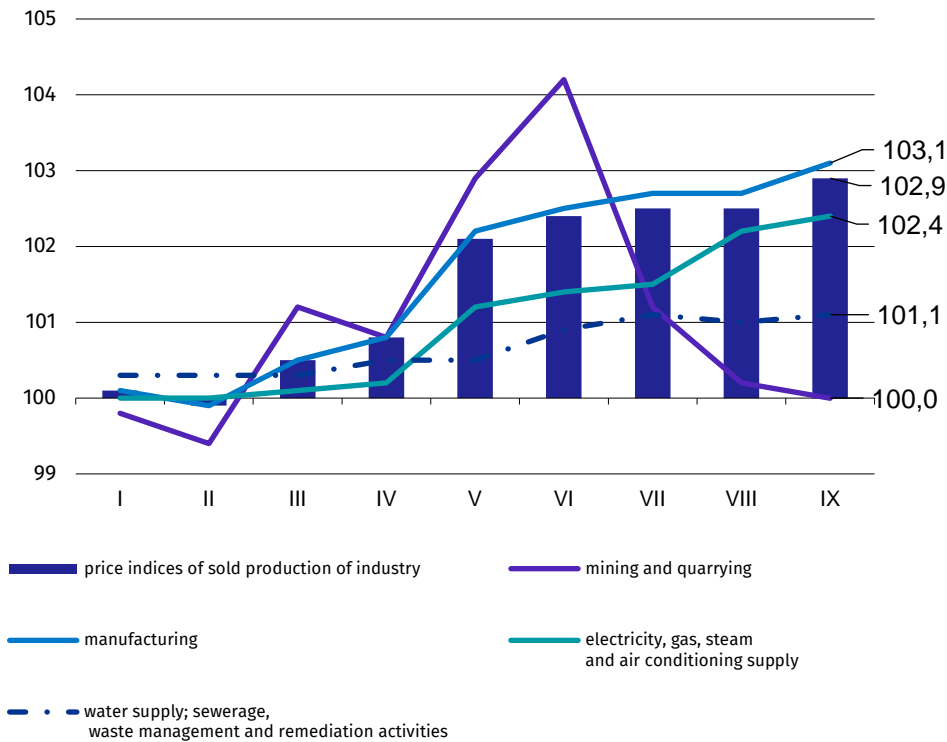


Chart 4. Dynamics of prices of sold production of industry sections in 2018 (XII previous year = 100)
