According to preliminary data, **the prices of sold production of industry** in June of 2011 were by 0.3% higher than in the previous month. The prices were increased in mining and quarrying (by 0.7%) as well as in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (by 0.6%). Prices were raised also in manufacturing by 0.2%, of which among other things in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (by 1.5%), of beverages (by 1.1%), of paper and paper products (by 0.8%), of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers, of leather and related products (by 0.7% each), of metal products (by 0.6%), of other non-metallic mineral products, of other transport equipment (by 0.4% each), of food products, of furniture, of wood, cork, straw and wicker, of rubber and plastic products (by 0.3% each) as well as of textiles (by 0.2%). The prices of printing and reproduction of recorded media reached the level similar to the one recorded in the previous month. However, the drop was recorded in the prices among other things of manufacturing of electrical equipment (of 0.2%), coke and refined petroleum products, of wearing apparel (of 0.5% each), of basic metals (of 0.8%). The prices in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply raised by 0.1%.

In comparison to December of the previous year the prices of sold production of industry raised by 3.9%. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (by 5.2%), of which in mining of coal and lignite (by 14.4%), by the drop in mining of metal ores (of 5.9%). The growth of prices was recorded in manufacturing (by 4.1%), of which the biggest in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 14.8%). Prices were raised also among other things of manufacture of basic metals (by 8.9%), of chemicals and chemical products (by 7.4%), of food products (by 6.4%), of rubber and plastic products (by 4.8%), of paper and paper products, of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 4.7% each), of beverages (by 3.6%), of pharmaceutical products (by 3.5%), of other non-metallic mineral products (by 2.9%), of metal products (by 2.2%) as well as of machinery and equipment (by 1.1%). However the drop was recorded in the prices among other things in manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers (of 0.6%), wearing apparel (of 1.5%), of printing and reproduction of recorded media (of 2.0%) as well as in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (of 2.6%). The prices in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities raised by 3.7% as well as in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply - by 1.1%.

In June of 2011 the prices of sold production of industry were by 5.6% higher than a year earlier. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (of 19.4%). The prices were also increased in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (of 5.6%), manufacturing (of 5.1%) as well as in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (of 2.4%).

It is estimated that **the prices of construction and assembly production** in June of 2011 were by 0.3% higher than in the previous month. The growth prices was recorded in construction of buildings, civil engineering (by 0.3% each) as well as in specialised construction activities (by 0.2%).

In June 2011 the prices of construction and assembly production were by 1.1% higher than in December of previous year and by 0.8% higher than in June of the previous year.

in 2010-2011

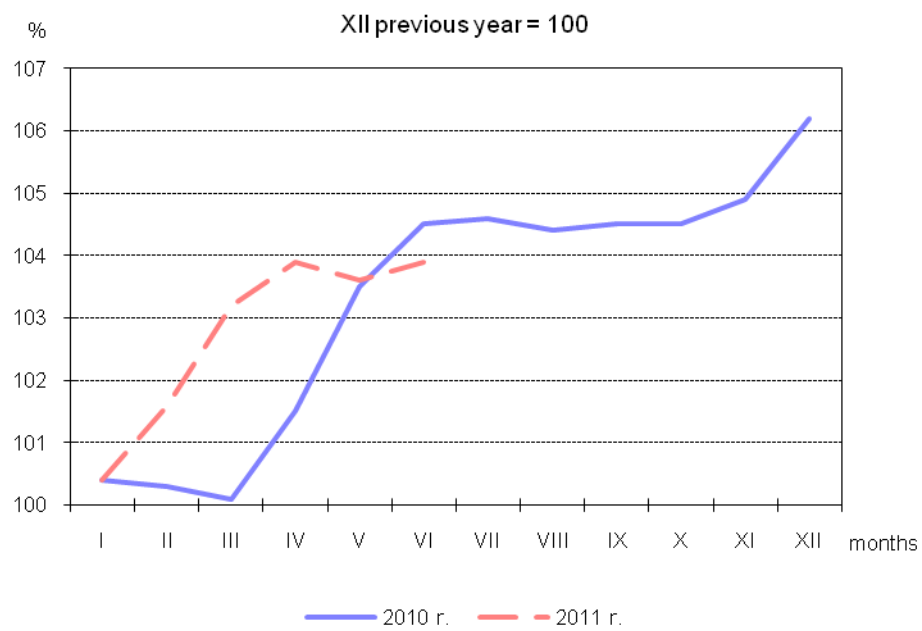

in 2010-2011

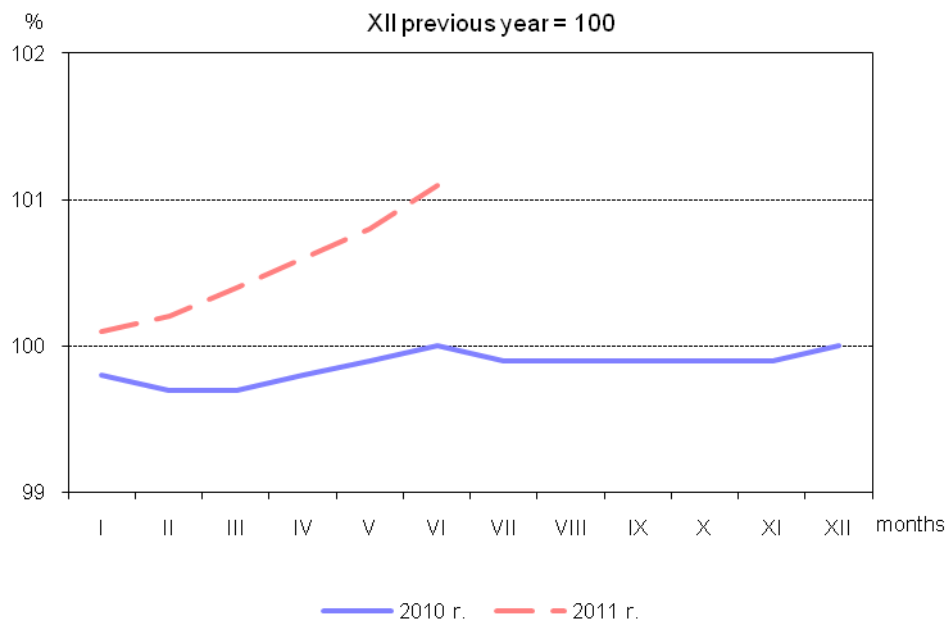

Dynamics of prices in 2011 XII previous year = 100

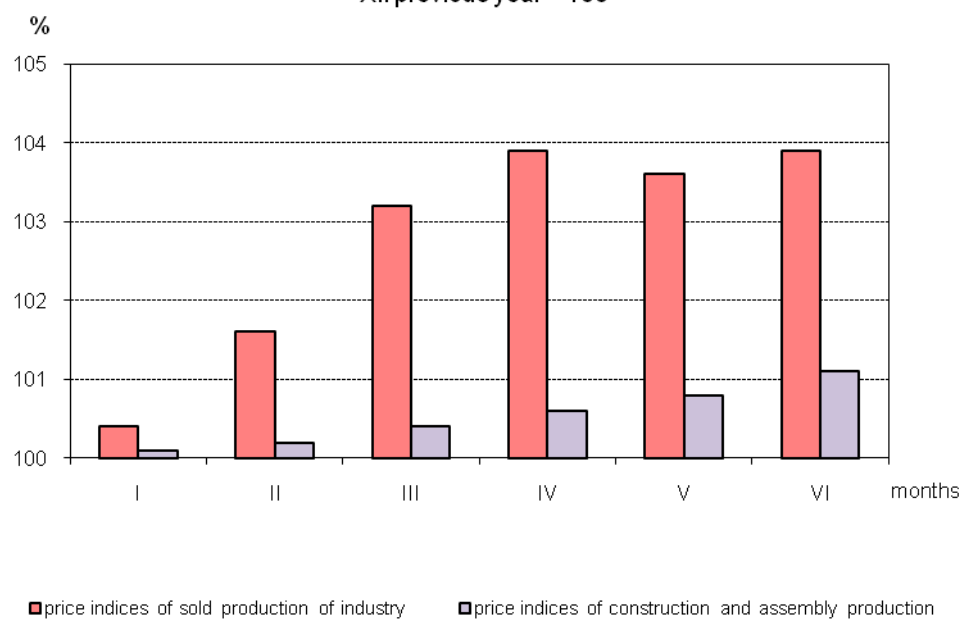
