

Employed persons in the national economy in Poland in March 2024

15 095.4 thousand number of employed persons

number of employed persons in the national economy as at 31 March 2024 As at the last day of March 2024 in the national economy there were 15 095.4 thousand employed persons. The mean age was 42.7 years, the median age was 42.0 years. The mean age and median age of employed persons in the national economy were similar for men and women.

The data refer to employed persons in national economy entities based in Poland who live in Poland or abroad.

Among the total number of employed persons in the national economy in Poland, men had a larger share. At the end of March 2024, their share was 52.8%. However, the sex structure of the employed varied according to their age. There was a predominance of men at essentially all ages, this was particularly evident at the threshold and the end of working life. In contrast, the share of women among employed persons in the national economy was larger only between the ages of 47-59.






Chart 1. Employed persons in the national economy by sex and age in 2024 As at 31 March

The sex structure of the employed also varied according to their place of residence. The predominance of women among employed persons occurred mainly in Poland's largest cities. As at 31 March 2024, the largest share of women – 56.2% – was recorded in the Lubuskie Voivodship, in the border urban gmina of Łęknica, and the smallest in the gmina of Puńsk in the Podlaskie Voivodship – 31.5%.





The share of women and men in the total number of employed persons in the national economy also varied according to the kind of activity of the entity in which they worked. As at 31 March 2024, the largest number of employed persons in the national economy, i.e. 2 783.5 thousand, were concentrated in Manufacturing, i.e. 18.4% of the total number of employed persons. In this section, women accounted for 34.6%. The second section in terms of the number of employed persons – Trade; repair of motor vehicles[△] concentrated 14.7% of the total number of employed persons, and the share of women was over 53%. As at the end of March 2024, the Human health and social work activities and Education sections were most feminised. Women accounted for 82.0% and 79.6% of employed persons in these sections, respectively. The most masculinised sections were Construction and Mining and quarrying, where the share of men was over 89%.

At the end of March 2024, the largest number of employed persons was in the Manufacturing section

Among both employed men and women, paid work was predominant. At the end of March 2024, 78.9% of all employed persons in the national economy were employees (wage and salaried workers).



The next largest grouping of employed persons in the national economy were self-employed persons including contributing family workers. As at 31 March 2024, there were 3 149.1 thousand of them and they accounted for 20.9% of the total number of employed persons in the national economy. In all PKD/NACE sections, self-employed persons including contributing family workers were dominated by those without employees. On the last day of March 2024, men accounted for 62% of the self-employed including contributing family workers
