

Employed persons in the national economy in Poland in January 2023

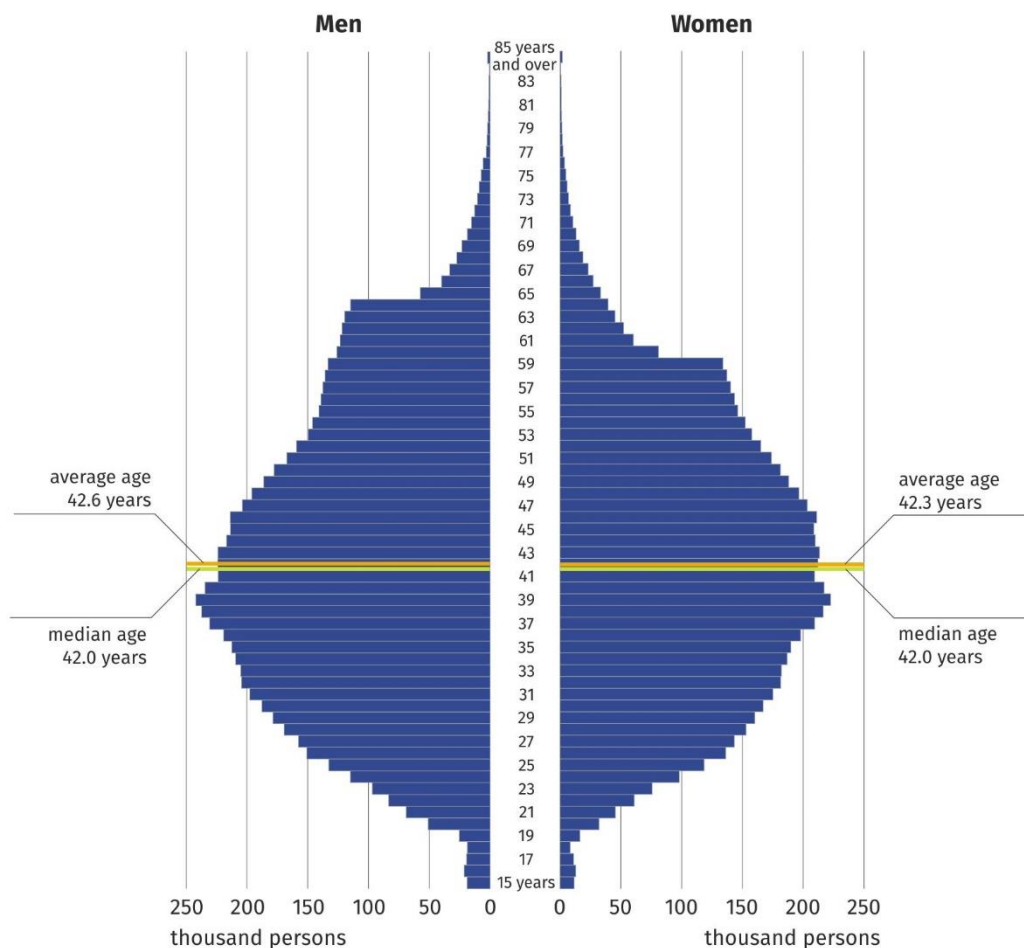

 number of employed persons in the national economy as at 31 January 2023

As at the last day of January 2023 in the national economy there were **15 043.4 thousand employed persons**. The average age was **42.4 years**, the median age was **42.0 years**. The average age and median age of employed persons in the national economy were similar for men and women.

The data refers to employed persons in national economy entities based in Poland who live in Poland or abroad.

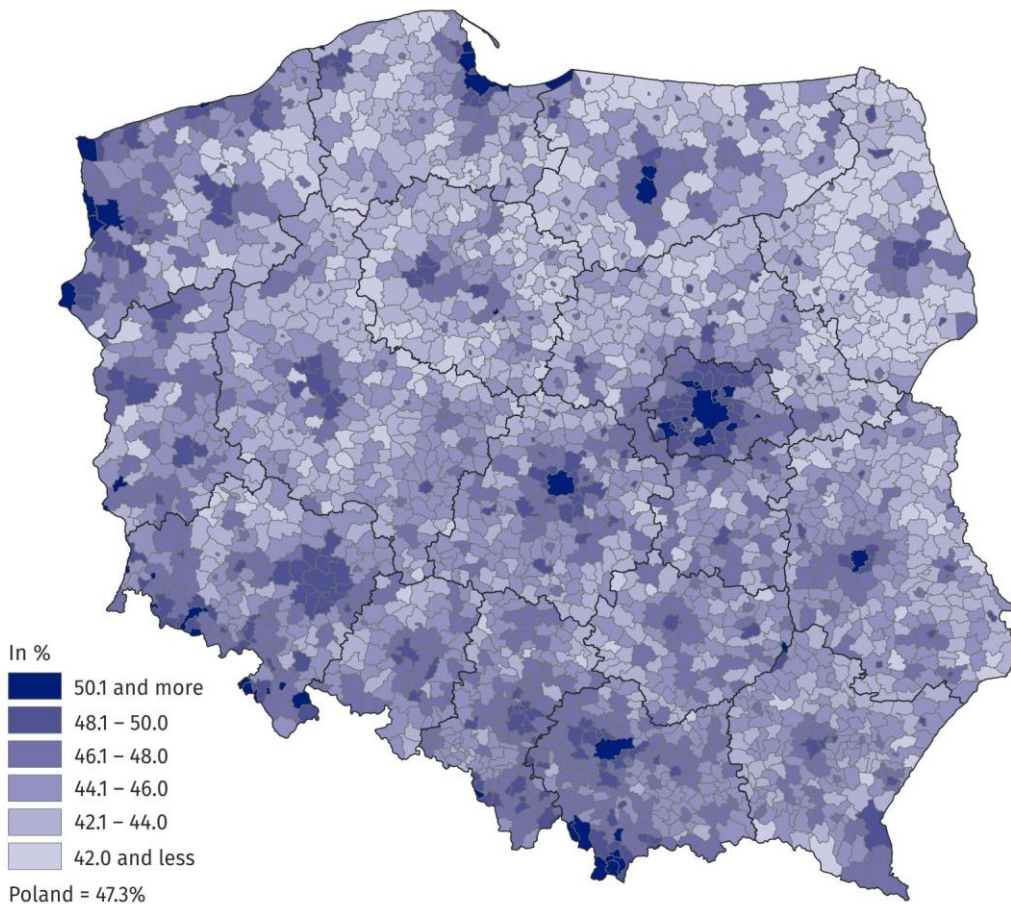
Among the total number of employed persons in the national economy in Poland, men had a larger share. At the end of January 2023, their share was 52.8%. However, the sex structure of the employed varied according to their age. There was a predominance of men at essentially all ages, and this was particularly evident at the threshold and end of working life. In contrast, the share of women among employed persons in the national economy was higher only between the ages of 47-59.

The sex structure of the employed also varied according to their place of residence. The predominance of women among employed persons occurred mainly in Poland's largest cities and gminas surrounding them; the further away from them, the smaller their share was relatively. As at 31 January 2023, the highest share of women – 56.7% – was recorded in the Małopolskie Voivodship, in the border gmina of Lipnica Wielka, and the smallest in the rural gmina of Puńsk in the Podlaskie Voivodship – 26.6%.

As at 31 January



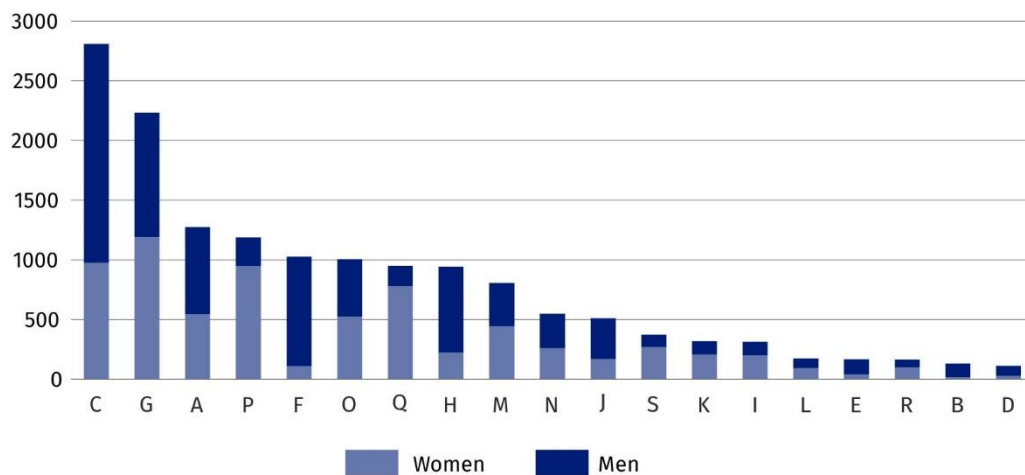
The share of women and men in the total number of employed persons in the national economy also varied according to the type of activity of the entity in which they worked. As at 31 January 2023, the largest number of employed persons in the national economy, i.e. 2 807.8 thousand, were concentrated in Manufacturing, i.e. 18.7% of the total number of employed persons. In this section, women accounted for 34.7%. The second section in terms of the number of employed persons – Trade; repair of motor vehicles^A concentrated 14.8% of the total number of employed persons, and the share of women was over 53%. As at the end of January 2023, the Human health and social work activities and Education sections were the most feminised. Women accounted for 82.2% and 79.7% of employed persons in these sections, respectively. The most masculinised sections were Construction and Mining and quarrying, where the share of men was almost 90%.

At the end of January 2023, the largest number of employed persons was in the Manufacturing section

Both male and female employment was dominated by paid work. At the end of January 2023, in paid employment was around 80% of all employed persons in the national economy.
