

Information regarding the labour market in the fourth quarter of 2019 (preliminary data)

Activity rate (by the LFS)

The results of the labour force survey (LFS) indicate that economically active persons in the fourth quarter of 2019, constituted 56.0% of the population aged 15 years and more. Compared with the third quarter of 2019, this indicator decreased by 0.7 percentage point, while compared to the fourth quarter of 2018 it stayed at similar level (a drop by 0.1 percentage point).

Economic activity of the population aged 15 years and more by the LFS


In the fourth quarter of 2019, the number of economically active population aged 15 years and more comprised 16953 thousand persons, of whom 16467 thousand comprise employed persons and 486 thousand – unemployed persons. The population of economically inactive persons amounted to 13313 thousand.

The population of the economically active decreased as compared with both: the third quarter of 2019, as well as the fourth quarter of 2018 (a drop by respectively 198 thousand and by 105 thousand), which was mainly the effect of further systematic decrease in the unemployed population. In turn, the number of economically inactive persons increased as compared with the third quarter of 2019, although it was smaller than in the fourth quarter of 2018.

The indicator defining the ratio of the number of persons not in employment (the unemployed and economically inactive aged 15 years and more) to the number of employed persons increased as compared with the third quarter of 2019, while it decreases as compared with the same period of 2018. In the fourth quarter of 2019, there were 838 unemployed or economically inactive persons per 1000 employed persons (in the third quarter of 2019 and in the fourth quarter of 2018 the respective figures comprised 822 and 853 persons).

Employed persons in the fourth quarter of 2019 constituted 54.4% of the population aged 15 years and more. Compared with the third quarter of 2019, the indicator decreased by 0.5 percentage point, while comparing the fourth quarter of 2019 to the fourth quarter of 2018, it increased by 0.4 percentage point.

Employed persons aged 15 years and more by the LFS

In the fourth quarter of 2019, the population of employed persons aged 15 years and more comprised 16467 thousand and it decreased as compared with the previous quarter, while it increased as compared with the fourth quarter of 2018.


A drop in the number of employed persons observed in comparison with the previous quarter was irrespective of sex and place of residence. Over the year, the number of the employed decreased among women, while it increased among men. As regards the place of residence, a growth in the number of the employed was observed in rural areas, while a drop – in urban areas.

Men still prevail among the total of the employed – in the fourth quarter of 2019 their share in this group comprised 55.7%.

The employment rate decreased as compared with the previous quarter, regardless of sex and place of residence (the highest drop – by 1.0 percentage point was observed among persons living in rural areas, while regarding sex – among men - by 0.8 percentage point). Over the year, a growth in the employment rate was recorded in all analysed groups, with the exception of the female population where this indicator stayed at the same level (among men growth by 0.9 percentage point, in urban areas by 0.3 percentage point, in rural areas by 0.7 percentage point).

In the fourth quarter of 2019, the employment rate was still clearly higher for men (63.5% vs. 46.1% for women).

Unemployment rate (by the LFS)

Unemployed persons in the fourth quarter of 2019 constituted 2.9% of the economically active population aged 15 years and more. The intensity of unemployment decreased as compared with the previous quarter, as well as compared with the fourth quarter of 2018

Unemployment rate maintained a decreasing tendency


Unemployed persons by the LFS

In the fourth quarter of 2019, the unemployed population comprised 486 thousand and it decreased as compared to both the previous quarter and the same period of 2018.

A drop in the number of unemployed persons observed over the quarter was irrespective of sex and place of residence. A reduction in unemployment over the year was observed in all analysed subpopulations, while regarding sex to a greater degree among men, then by the place of residence - among rural residents.

Unemployment rate decreased as compared with the same period of 2018, as well as compared with the previous quarter. Beginning from 2016, a drop in unemployment has been accompanied by decreasing diversification of unemployment intensity by sex. In the fourth quarter of 2019, unemployment rate of women stayed at a slightly higher level than for men (respectively 3.2% vs. 2.6%).

Registered unemployment rate

Unemployed persons registered in labour offices¹ at the end of December 2019 constituted 5.2% of the civilian economically active population. Registered unemployment rate increased as compared with September 2019 by 0.1 percentage point, while compared with the end of December 2018 - it decreased by 0.6 percentage point.



The number of unemployed persons registered in labour offices at the end of December 2019 comprised 866.4 thousand (including 479.4 thousand women) and it was higher than the one recorded at the end of the third quarter of the last year by 15.2 thousand (i.e. by 1.8%), although it was lower by 102.5 thousand (i.e. by 10.6%) as compared with December 2018.

In the fourth quarter of 2019 as compared with the third quarter of 2019, a growth was observed in the number of unemployed men by 19.1 thousand (i.e. 5.2%), while a drop was recorded in the number of unemployed women by 3.9 thousand (i.e. 0.8%). Whereas, compared with the fourth quarter of 2018, the population of unemployed men and women registered in labour offices decreased by respectively: 39.3 thousand persons (i.e. by 9.2%) and by 63.2 thousand (i.e. by 11.7%).

In the labour offices in the fourth quarter of 2019, fewer unemployed persons than in the third quarter of 2019 were registered, at the same time, fewer unemployed persons were deregistered from the unemployment register rolls

The share of economically inactive persons in the total number of the population aged 15 years and more

Economically inactive persons in the fourth quarter of 2019 constituted 44.0% of the total number of the population aged 15 years and more. The percentage increased as compared with the previous quarter (by 0.7 percentage point) and was similar to the one recorded in the same period of 2018 (a growth by 0.1 percentage point).

Economically inactive persons


In the fourth quarter of 2019, the population of economically inactive persons comprised 13313 thousand. It was at the level higher as compared with the previous quarter (13124 thousand persons; a growth by 1.4%), while compared with the situation one year ago, it decreased by 0.3%.

The increase in this population compared to the previous quarter was observed both among women (by 1.6%) and men (by 1.1%) and regardless of the place of residence, however it was more pronounced among rural residents (by 3.0%) than cities (by 0.4%). Over the year, among women a slight growth in the number of this group was observed (by 0.3%), while among men – a drop (by 1.2%). As regards the place of residence, in urban areas a drop in the number of economically inactive population was observed (by 0.5%), while no significant changes were noted among the total number of rural residents.

Women still constitute a majority of the economically inactive population (62.2%).

Among the total number of the economically inactive a decided majority comprise retirees (56.5%), the second largest group constitute pupils and students (15.9%). Whereas, in case of economically inactive persons at working age the most often reasons for inactivity are: family and household responsibilities (34.6%), illness or disability (25.5%) and education and training (24.3%).
