

Index numbers of industrial and construction-assembly production in November 2016^{a)}

In November of 2016, **sold production of industry** was by 3.3% higher than in November of 2015, whereas a decrease of 12.8% was reported in **construction-assembly production**. In the period January-November of 2016, sold production of industry was by 3.1% higher than in the corresponding period of 2015 which saw a 4.7% increase, whereas construction-assembly production was by 15.3% lower than in the corresponding period of 2015 which saw a 3.3% increase.

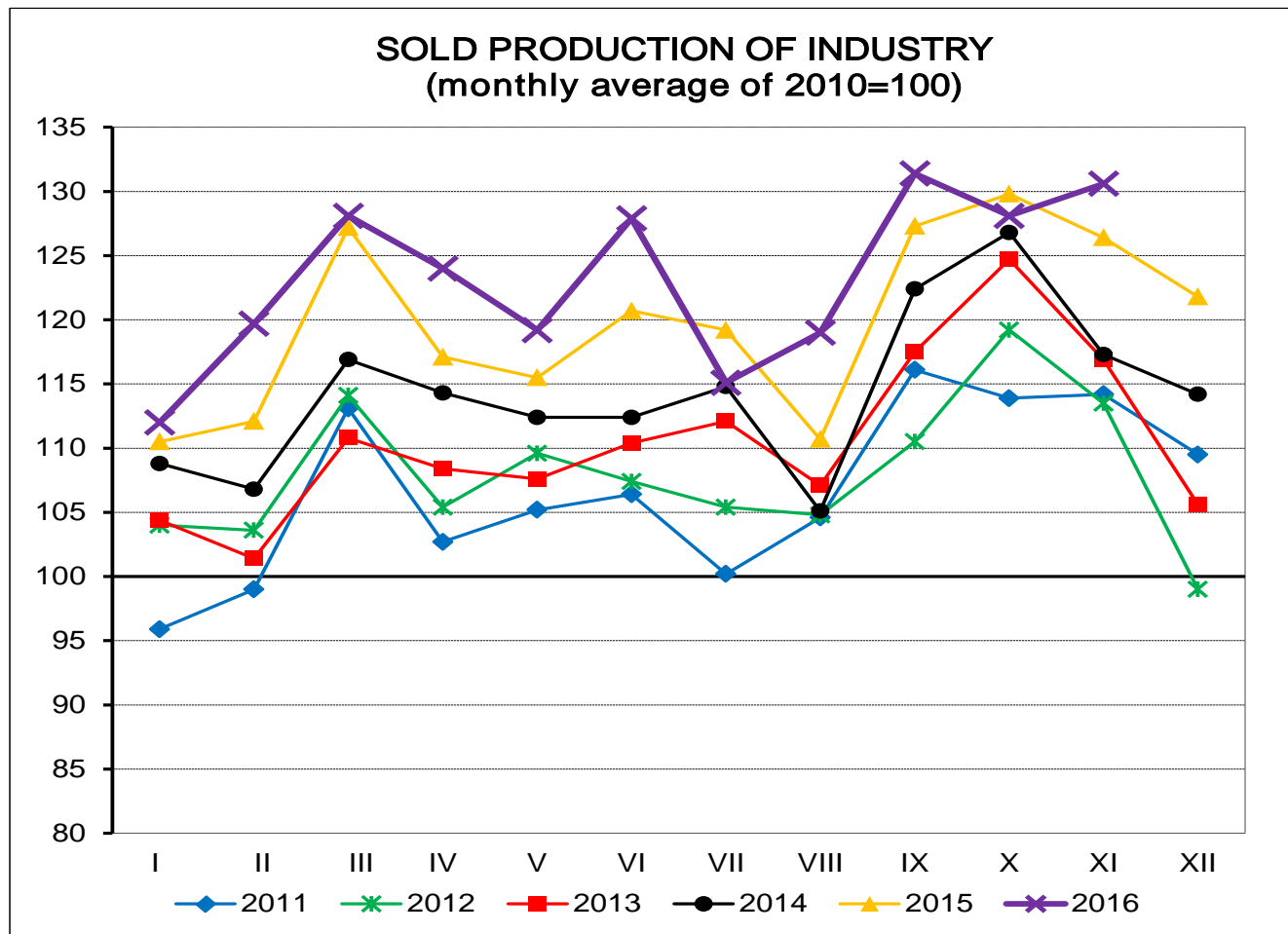

According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons), in November of 2016, was by 3.3% higher than in the previous year (when an increase of 7.8% was recorded) and by 1.9% higher than in October of 2016. After eliminating the seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 3.0% than in the corresponding month of 2015 and by 2.1% higher as compared to October of 2016.

As compared to November of 2015, an increase in sold production was reported in 24 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of furniture – by 12.2%, manufacture of other nonmetallic mineral product – by 10.5%, manufacture of metal products – by 9.0%, manufacture of food products and manufacture of basic metals – by 8.8% each, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 7.6%, manufacture of paper and paper products – by 7.0%, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 6.5%, manufacture of chemicals and chemical products – by 4.8%, manufacture of rubber and plastic products – by 4.6%. A decrease in sold production of industry, as compared to November of 2015, was recorded in 10 divisions, among others, in repair and installation of machinery and equipment – by 21.9%, mining of coal and lignite – by 10.8%, in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply – by 7.3%, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 5.9%.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2010 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in November of 2016 by 12.8% lower than a year before (regarding an increase in 2015 – by 1.2%) and by 5.4% higher in comparison to October of 2016. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 13.2% lower than in November of the previous year and by 6.7% higher in comparison to October of 2016.

In relation to November of 2015 a decrease in production was recorded in all divisions of construction: in entities dealing mainly with construction of buildings – by 14.6%, in entities involved in specialised construction activities – by 13.2% and in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 11.4%.

In comparison to October of 2016 an increase in production was recorded in all divisions of construction: in entities dealing mainly with construction of buildings – by 6.0%, in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 5.3% and in entities involved in specialised construction activities – by 4.9%
