

## Transport of goods and passengers in 2023

Increase in passenger transport compared to 2023

In 2023, compared to the previous year, the number of passengers transported by all modes, except maritime transport, increased. On the other hand, the total volume of goods and the tonne-kilometres performed decreased slightly.

## **Transport of goods**

In 2023, in relation to the previous year, the volume of goods and the transport performance decreased in all modes of transport. The exception was road goods transport for hire or remunaration, where a slight increase in the amount of transported goods was recorded. Tonne-kilometres performed, in relation to the previous year, lowered in most modes of transport; the increase was only observed in rail and maritime transport.

In 2023, all modes of transport carried less goods than in the previous year.



In 2023 goods from the group of "metal ores and other mining and quarrying products; peat; uranium and thorium" had the biggest share (23.2%) in transport structure. In maritime transport, the "roll-on roll-off self-propelled units" group of goods constituted the largest part (60.2%).


Graph 1. Structure of goods transport by groups of goods in 2023 and year-over-year fluctuations <sup>a</sup>

In 2023 self-propelled rolling units dominated the structure by groups of goods transported by sea (60.2%)

Considering directions of transport, in 2023 most of goods transported by road (81.7%) and rail (65.3%) were carried in national traffic, whereas international conveyance prevailed in other modes of transport.

Taking into account national traffic by distance classes, one can note that in 2023 the most goods were transported by road for a distance of up to 50 km, by rail for a distance of 150–299 km and up to 50 km, while by inland waterway for a distance of 50–149 km.

## **Transport of passengers**

In 2023, there was an increase in passenger transport by all modes, a slight decrease was noted only in maritime traffic. In total, 13.1% more passengers were conveyed year-over-year. The largest increase was recorded in air transport (by 26.1%), as well as in road transport (by 18.7%), railway transport (by 9.2%) and in inland waterway transport (by 2.5%).
