




**Chart 1. Children in facilities for children up to age of 3<sup>a</sup> by sex and age in 2021**

a Child care may be performed up to the end of the school year when child reaches age of 3 or when it is either impossible or impeded to provide child with pre-school education – up to age of 4.

Throughout 2021, 256.4 thousand children stayed in facilities, including 1.5 thousand disabled children. Local government covered, partly or entirely, the costs of accommodation in facilities for 65.5% of children.


### Facilities

At the end of the analysed period, there were 5.0 thousand facilities for children up to age of 3 in Poland, including 4.2 thousand nurseries. Facilities in private sector (75.4%) accounted for three times more than facilities in public sector (24.6%). Most of nurseries and children's clubs in private sector were run by physical person (66.9%), then by limited liability companies (11.5%) and by civil law partnership company (9.2%). Local government run the biggest number of nurseries and children's clubs in the public sector (over 97%). Every nursery ward was affiliated with kindergartens, most of them with public kindergartens (90.0%).

65.9% of all facilities for small children were open 5 to 10 hours a day, 33.4% worked even over 10 hours a day. Only children's clubs were open up to 5 hours a day (0.7% of total).

58.4% of facilities for small children had amenities for the disabled children. Mostly there were slipways, driveways and platforms (37.2% of total), bathrooms adapted for disabled children (26.9%) and non-slip floors (26.4%).

### Places

The number of places in all facilities for children up to age of 3 increased from 173.5 thousand in 2020 to 191.6 thousand in 2021. There were 116.4 thousand places in nurseries, children’s clubs and nursery wards in private sector and 75.2 thousand places in public sector.

In private sector, there were 33 places per one nursery on average and in public sector average value was two times higher – 66 places. In the case of nursery wards there were 15 and 38 places respectively and in children’s clubs – 19 and 21.


### Staff

31.8 thousand people worked in facilities for children at age up to 3. Children’s carers prevailed among the employees in facilities – almost 72%. Teachers accounted for more than 10% of the total number of employees. The vast majority of employees were women – 99.2%. Facilities for children up to age of 3 were the main workplace for over 90% of children’s carers and teachers. In the case of midwives and nurses, the share was evidently lower and accounted for 49% and 39% respectively.

Nurseries, children’s clubs and nursery wards were supported by volunteers. Throughout the year, 485 volunteers worked in those facilities. Their number increased by nearly 14% compared to the previous year.
