According to preliminary data, **the prices of sold production of industry** in November of 2010 were by 0.3% higher than in the previous month. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (by 1.8%), of which in mining of metal ores by 6.2% by the drop in mining of coal and lignite - of 0.5%. Prices in manufacturing raised by 0.2%, of which in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 2.1%). Prices were raised also among other things in manufacture of leather and related products (by 1.6%), of chemicals and chemical products (by 1.3%), of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 1.0%), of printing and reproduction of recorded media (by 0.9%), of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers (by 0.7%), of furniture (by 0.5%), of paper and paper products (by 0.3%), of rubber and plastic products, of beverages, of wearing apparel (by 0.2% each), of metal products (by 0.1%). However the drop prices was recorded among other things in manufacturing of other non-metallic mineral products, of textiles (of 0.1% each), of food products (of 0.2%), of computer, electronic and optical products (of 0.5%), of machinery and equipment, of pharmaceutical products (of 0.6% each), basic metals (of 0.9%), of electrical equipment, of tobacco products (of 1.1% each), of other transport equipment (of 1.4%). The increase of prices was recorded in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (by 0.1%), however prices in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply were at a level similar to the one recorded in the previous month.

In comparison to December of the previous year the prices of sold production of industry raised by 4.8%. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (of 17.0%), of which in mining of metal ores (of 31.2%) and in mining of coal and lignite (of 12.5%). The prices in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities raised by 5.2% and in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply - by 5.1%. The growth of prices was recorded in manufacturing (by 3.9%), of which in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 30.3%). Prices were raised also among other things in manufacture of basic metals (by 18.9%), of paper and paper products (by 11.9%), of tobacco products (by 9.1%), of chemicals and chemical products (by 7.7%), of products of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 4.4%), of pharmaceutical products (by 3.2%), of food products (by 3.0%), of leather and related products (by 2.9%), of rubber and plastic products (by 2.6%), other transport equipment (by 2.4%). However the drop was recorded in the prices among other things in manufacture of furniture (by 1.1%), of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers (by 1.2%), of machinery and equipment (by 2.6%), of other non-metallic mineral products (by 3.6%), of computer, electronic and optical products (by 4.3%), of wearing apparel (by 4.8%) as well as of electrical equipment (by 5.6%).

In November of 2010 the prices of sold production of industry were by 4.6% higher than a year earlier. The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (of 19.3%). The prices were also increased in sections: water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (of 5.7%), electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (of 5.1%) as well as in manufacturing (of 3.4%).

It is estimated that **the prices of construction and assembly production** in November of 2010 were at a level similar to the one recorded in the previous month. The growth prices was recorded in civil engineering as well as in specialised construction (by 0.1% each). However, the prices in construction of buildings were of 0.1% lower than in the previous month.

The prices of construction and assembly production in November of 2010 were at a level similar to the one recorded in the previous year and of 0.1% lower than in December of previous year.

Dynamics of prices of sold production of industry in 2009-2010



Dynamics of prices of construction and assembly production in 2009-2010



Dynamics of prices in 2010 XII previous year = 100


