Day-support centre

Definition:

A centre which supports the family in its care and education functions.

The centre may be operated in the form of: 1) care centre, including interest circles, day-rooms, clubs, educational centres, provides a child with: care and education, assistance in learning, organisation of leisure time, entertainment and sport classes and development of interests, 2) specialist centre - organises socio-therapeutic, therapeutic, corrective, compensating and speech therapy classes, implement an individual corrective programme, a psychocorrective or psychopreventive programme, in particular pedagogic, psychological and sociotherapy, 3) street work - carries out motivating and sociotherapeutic activities. A day support centre may be operated in a combination of the forms i.e. combining tasks of the general care, specialized and street work centres.
