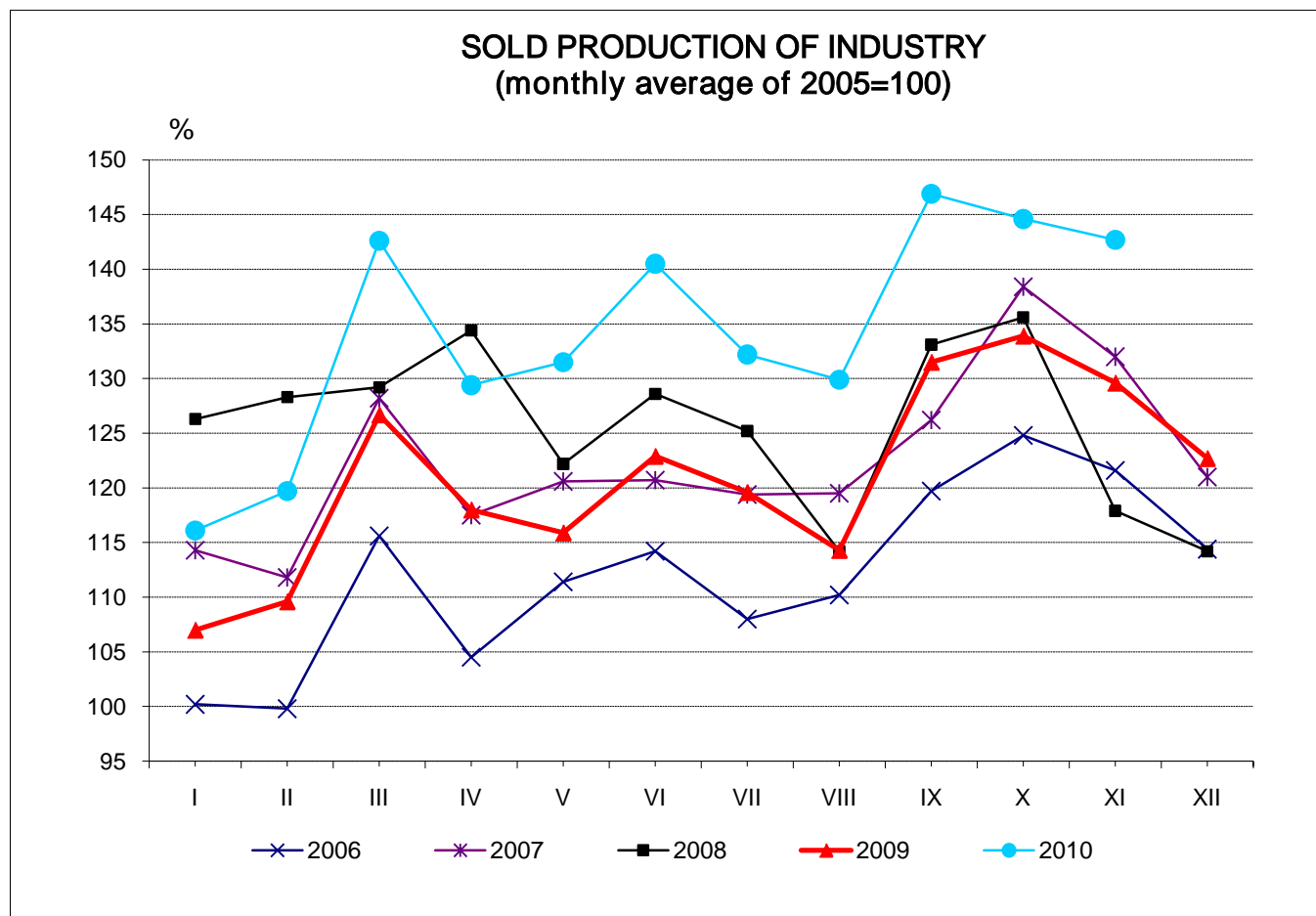

According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in November 2010 was by 10,1% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but lower by 1,3% than in October 2010. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 7,3% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and was by 0,6% higher than in October 2010.

As compared to November 2009, an increase in sold production was reported in 25 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 27,0%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 24,8%, manufacture of metal products – by 23,9%, manufacture of rubber and plastic products – by 22,0% and manufacture of electrical equipment – by 16,9%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to November 2009, was recorded in 9 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of other transport equipment – by 15,9%, mining of coal and lignite – by 11,7%, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 4,0%, manufacture of beverages – by 3,0% and manufacture of furniture – by 2,2%.

In the period January-November 2010 sold production of industry was by 9,7% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 is presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair works, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in November 2010 was by 14,2% higher than in the previous year and by 10,8% lower than in October 2010. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached a level by 10,9% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 2,4% in comparison to October 2010.

In relation to November of the previous year, an increase in the level of conducted works was recorded in all construction divisions, i.e. in entities engaged mainly in specialised construction activities – by 30,3%, in enterprises the basic activity of which is civil engineering – by 20,0% and in entities engaged mainly in construction works connected with construction of buildings – by 1,8%.

In comparison to October 2010, a decline of production occurred in all construction divisions and amounted to: in enterprises the basic activity of which is construction of buildings 19,2%, in entities realizing specialised construction works 9,5%, and in enterprises carrying out construction works connected with civil engineering 2,4%.

In the period January-November of 2010 the level of the construction and assembly production was by 2,3% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
