Increase y/y average paid employment in the enterprise sector

In February 2022, average paid employment in the enterprise sector compared to February 2021 was higher by 2.2% y/y and amounted to 6474.9 thousand full-time equivalents. In comparison to the previous month average paid employment minimally increased (by 0,2%).

Increase y/y average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector

Average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector in February 2022 compared to February 2021 were higher by 11.7% y/y and amounted to 6220.04 PLN. In regard to January 2022 average gross wages and salaries increased by 2.6%.

Labour market in the enterprise sector

Data regarding the enterprise sector concerns units conducting **economic activity classified into selected**² **kinds of activity by NACE Rev.2 with 10 or more employed persons.** Therefore, the survey does not include, inter alia, public administration, education, human health and social work activities.

In February in comparison to January 2022 **average paid employment in the enterprise sector** increased only minimally, by 0.2%. Similar increase was visible also in February 2021 in regard to January 2021 and amounted to 0.3%. An increase in average paid employment in February 2022 was caused among others by admissions in the units, including employing seasonal workers.

Comparing February 2022 to February 2021 average paid employment increased by 2.2%, while in February 2021 in regard to February 2020 its decrease by 1.7% was noted.




Chart 1. Average paid employment in the enterprise sector

Due to the epidemic situation and its impact on the labour market, from March to May 2020 there was noted a decrease in the average paid employment in the enterprise sector month to month, while from June 2020 till December 2020 its increase was observed. In 2021, average paid employment changed slightly, however until December 2021, it had still not returned to the values noted at the beginning of 2020. Both in January and February 2022 an increase in average paid employment in regard to the previous month was visible, wherein in February 2022 in comparison to January 2022 average paid employment increased by approx. 15 thousand full-time equivalents.


In February 2022 **average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector** increased in relation to the one recorded in January 2022 by 2.6%, while in February 2021 compared to January 2021 wages and salaries noted a smaller growth, by 0.6%.

The increase in wages and salaries in February 2022 in regard to January 2022 was caused among others by payments of additional, quarterly and semi-annual bonuses, annual awards, increasing wages and salaries, including mobility package related, as well as overtime pays (which beside the base salary are also included as components of wages and salaries). The highest increase in wages and salaries in comparison to the previous month was noted in section "Mining and quarrying" (by 36.1%), where average gross wages and salaries amounted to 10571.51 PLN (a month before 7768.73 PLN) and "Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply" (by 9.2%), where average gross wages and salaries were 9536.43 PLN (a month before 8735.60 PLN). A drop in average wages and salaries was noted in section "Agri-

Average monthly gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector includes the base salary and additional salary components, incl. bonuses, awards, remuneration for overtime and retirement severance pays culture, forestry and fishing"³ (by 9.6%%), where payments amounted to 7241.19 PLN (a month before 8010.16 PLN) and section "Arts, entertainment and recreation" (by 1.4%), where wages and salaries decreased to 5265.38 PLN (a month before amounted to 5338,20 PLN).

Annually (February 2022 to February 2021) average gross wages and salaries increased by 11.7%. A year before (February 2021 to February 2020) an average wages growth rate of 4.5% was noted.

In 2022 statutory minimum monthly wage increased to 3010 PLN, i.e. by 7.5% in regard to the previous year when it was 2800 PLN

In the cumulative period of two months of 2022 average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector, in relation to the same period of the previous year, increased in all NACE Rev.2 sections by between 7.8% in section "Other service activities" and 15.4% in section "Accommodation and catering", which resulted in total average monthly wages and salaries increase of 10.9%. The highest average monthly gross salary in the enterprise sector in cumulative period was noted in section "Information and communication" in the amount of 10623.93 PLN (an increase by 9.2% in regard to the corresponding period of the previous year), while the lowest in section "Accommodation and catering" at the level of 4473.13 PLN (despite an increase in relation to the situation in the previous year by 15.4%).

Methodological notes

The enterprise sector concerns units with 10 or more employed persons and conducting economic activity within the scope of the following areas: forestry and logging; marine fishing; mining and quarrying; manufacturing; electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities; construction; wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; transportation and storage; accommodation and food service activities; information and communication; real estate activities; legal and accounting activities; activities of head offices; management consultancy activities; architectural and engineering activities; technical testing and analysis; advertising and market research; other professional, scientific and technical activities; administrative and support service activities; arts, entertainment and recreation; repair of computers and personal and household goods; other personal service activities.

³ Within the enterprise sector this section covers only the activities "Forestry and logging" (Division 02) and "Marine fishing" (Class 03.11).

⁴ Within the enterprise sector, this section does not include activity "Activities of membership organisations" (Division 94).

Data source is "Report on economic activity" (DG-1). Within the scope of this survey, for the entities with 50 and more persons employed it is a census survey, while for the entities from 10 to 49 persons employed it is a sample one⁵.

Labour market data on survey report DG-1 do not include persons employed under a mandate contract and contract for specified work - the detailed scope of exclusions along with methods of calculating labour market variables can be found in the explanations of the DG-1 report.

Due to the short period in which the units provide data as part of the survey on the DG-1 form, the presented results are preliminary. In the absence of complete records as at the date of preparation of the survey, it is allowed to include estimated data, and in the event of the need to correct data disclosed in previous periods, changes are included only in cumulative data.
