Increase y/y average paid employment in the enterprise sector In April 2022, average paid employment in the enterprise sector compared to April 2021 was higher by 2.8% y/y and amounted to 6496.6 thousand full-time equivalents. In comparison to the previous month average paid employment increased minimally (by 0.2%).

Increase y/y average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector

Average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector in April 2022 compared to April 2021 were higher by 14.1% y/y and amounted to 6626.95 PLN. In regard to March 2022 average gross wages and salaries decreased by 0.6%.

Labour market in the enterprise sector

Data regarding the enterprise sector concerns units conducting **economic activity classified into selected**² **kinds of activity by NACE Rev.2 with the number of employed persons 10 or more people.** Therefore, the survey does not include, inter alia, public administration, education, human health and social work activities.

In April in comparison to March 2022 **average paid employment in the enterprise sector** increased minimally (by 0.2%), unlike in April 2021 when in regard to March 2021 its minimal

The enterprise sector is part of the national economy, which means that the data refers to selected entities conducting economic activity



decrease was visible (by 0.2%). An increase in average paid employment in April 2022 was caused among others by admissions in the units, return of employees from sick and unpaid leaves and increasing time frames of part-time employees.

Comparing April 2022 to April 2021 average paid employment in the enterprise sector increased by 2.8%, while in April 2021 the increase in annual terms was much lower and amounted to 0.9%.

Chart 1. Average paid employment in the enterprise sector



Due to the epidemic situation and its impact on the labour market, from March to May 2020 there was noted a decrease in the average paid employment in the enterprise sector month to month, while from June 2020 till December 2020 its increase was observed. In 2021, average paid employment changed slightly, however until December 2021, it had still not returned to the values noted at the beginning of 2020. Since the beginning of 2022 an increase in average paid employment in regard to the previous month is visible, wherein in April 2022 in comparison to March 2022 average paid employment increased by approx. 11.7 thousand full-time equivalents.


In April 2022 average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector decreased in relation to the one recorded in March 2022 by 0.6%, while in April 2021 compared to March 2021 wages and salaries noted a bigger decrease, i.e. by 2.1%.

The decrease in average wages and salaries in April 2022 in regard to March 2022 was caused among others by payments of discretionary, jubilee, holiday and quarterly bonuses, annual awards, increasing wages and salaries, including mobility package related, overtime pays and retirement severance pays (which beside the base salary are also included as components of wages and salaries) in the previous month and also smaller number of working days in April 2022 compared to the previous month. Decrease in wages and salaries was noted i.a. in section "Mining and quarrying" (by 11.8%), where wages and salaries amounted to 8929.08 PLN (a month before 10128.17 PLN) and section "Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply" (by 5.6%), where wages and salaries declined to 9140.01 PLN (a month before amounted to 9681.28 PLN). The highest increase in wages and salaries in comparison to the

Average monthly gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector includes the base salary and additional salary components, incl. bonuses, awards, remuneration for overtime and retirement severance pays previous month was noted in section "Agriculture, forestry and fishing" (by 27.4%), where wages and salaries increased to 9214.25 PLN (a month before 7230.00 PLN).

Annually (April 2022 to April 2021) average monthly gross wages and salaries increased by 14.1%. A year before (April 2021 to April 2020) an average wages growth rate of 9.9% was noted.

In 2022 statutory minimum monthly wage increased to 3010 PLN, i.e. by 7.5% in regard to the previous year when it was 2800 PLN

In the cumulative period of four months of 2022 average gross wages and salaries in the enterprise sector, in relation to the same period of 2021, increased in all NACE Rev.2 sections by between 6.3% in section "Other service activities" and 18.8% in section "Accommodation and catering", which resulted in total increase of 12.4%. The highest average monthly gross salary in the enterprise sector in cumulative period was noted in section "Information and communication" in the amount of 11241.36 PLN (an increase by 11.7% in regard to the corresponding period of the previous year), while the lowest in section "Accommodation and catering" at the level of 4628.67 PLN (despite an increase in relation to the situation in the previous year by 18.8%, as mentioned above).

Methodological notes

The enterprise sector concerns units with with the number of employed persons 10 or more people and conducting economic activity within the scope of the following areas: forestry and logging; marine fishing; mining and quarrying; manufacturing; electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities; construction; wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; transportation and storage; accommodation and food service activities; information and communication; real estate activities; legal and accounting activities; activities of head offices; management consultancy activities; architectural and engineering activities; technical testing and analysis; advertising and market research; other professional, scientific and technical activities; administrative and support service activities; arts, entertainment and recreation; repair of computers and personal and household goods; other personal service activities.

³ Within the enterprise sector this section covers only the activities "Forestry and logging" (Division 02) and "Marine fishing" (Class 03.11).

⁴ Within the enterprise sector, this section does not include activity " Activities of membership organisations" (Division 94).

Data source is "Report on economic activity" (DG-1). Within the scope of this survey, for the entities with the number of employed persons 50 and more people it is a census survey, while for the entities with the number of employed persons from 10 to 49 people it is a sample one⁵.

Labour market data on survey report DG-1 do not include persons employed under a mandate contract and contract for specified work - the detailed scope of exclusions along with methods of calculating labour market variables can be found in the explanations of the DG-1 report.

Due to the short period in which the units provide data as part of the survey on the DG-1 form, the presented results are preliminary. In the absence of complete records as at the date of preparation of the survey, it is allowed to include estimated data, and in the event of the need to correct data disclosed in previous periods, changes are included only in cumulative data.
